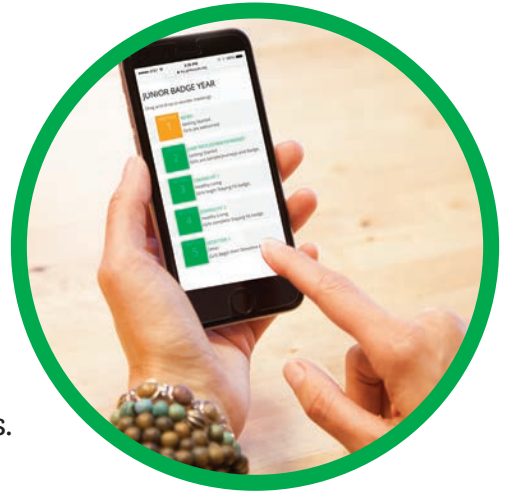

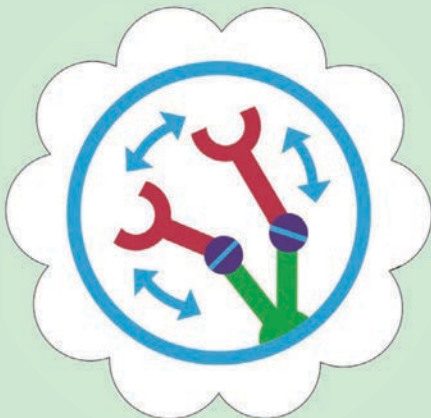

## CORE LEARNING

### The Core Learning Plan for Troop Volunteers: Two Easy Steps

At least one volunteer at each troop meeting or outing must have completed both of the Core Learning Plan requirements:

#### 1 Troop Pathway Orientation

This orientation takes new troop volunteers through the process of starting a troop. Learn about membership requirements, meeting locations, troop checking accounts, strategies for involving girls' families, required paperwork, safety guidelines, start-up costs, uniforms and the online Volunteer Toolkit. Offered in-person and online! Prerequisite: Girl Scout membership.

#### 2 Level-Specific Essentials

Each Essentials session covers what you need to know to lead a troop at your level, including petals or badges, Journeys, high awards (for older girls), how to promote a girl-led environment, and how to incorporate the Volunteer Toolkit into meeting planning. Prerequisites: Girl Scout membership, Troop Pathway Orientation and completion of one to two troop meetings.

- Daisy Essentials: two-hour, in-person sessions
- Brownie Essentials: two-hour, in-person sessions
- Junior Essentials: two-hour, in-person sessions
- Cadette Essentials: online sessions

All Core Learning Plan trainings are provided free of charge to volunteers.

## SAFETY AND SKILLS TRAINING

Many programs require additional volunteer training in order to keep girls safe and provide them with the best possible experiences. Take advantage of safety and skills trainings to open the door to new opportunities for you and your troop.

### Archery Training

Take your archery skills to the next level. Learn range set-up, safety rules, procedures, commands, and how to teach the basic form. There is a one-hour written final exam, and passing both the exam and the practical skills component will certify you as a USA Level 1 Instructor.

**Adults: \$55**

### Encampment Director Training

This training is required for coordinators of service unit or large group camp experiences. It covers encampment director requirements and responsibilities including: assessing service unit readiness, planning timelines, safety policies and procedures, girl-led planning, program ideas and property information. Complete nine months prior to encampment. Prerequisites: Past participation in one encampment, Brownie Camping or Junior Camping program, and Troop Camping Skills—Tent.

**Adults: free**

### MEDIC First Aid and CPR (Blended Model)

Qualify as a First Aid-trained volunteer. This course is offered in two parts: an online program and a hands-on skills session with an instructor. The online portion must be completed prior to the in-person session, and both portions must be completed for certification. Certification is valid for two years. Course fee includes take-home resource book, keychain CPR mask and certification card.

**Adults: \$60**

### MEDIC First Aid and CPR Recertification

This course is for those whose First Aid and CPR certifications are about to expire or have expired within 30 days of the listed session. Recertification is valid for two years. Course fee includes take-home resource book, keychain CPR mask and certification card.

**Adults: \$30**

### BE PREPARED.

When preparing for any activity with girls, be sure to refer to safety guidelines in these places:

1. *Volunteer Essentials*
2. *Safety Activity Checkpoints*

### Online Overnight Orientation

This 41-minute on-demand video is required viewing for at least one volunteer accompanying girls on an overnight trip, but all volunteers are encouraged to view it. An overnight trip is one or two nights at non-camp facilities, which includes indoor council-sponsored events, indoor event overnights, indoor troop overnights and indoor service unit overnights. This orientation should be completed at least three to four weeks before the overnight trip.

**Adults: free**

### Troop Camping Skills—Lodge

Completion of this course enables participants to take troops camping in lodges or cabins, or to attend town lodge encampments and council-sponsored Brownie Camping. A "lodge" is any building with a stove and flush toilets. Explore ways to ensure a girl-led experience, safety and risk management, packing tips, menu planning and outdoor cooking. Pre-course work required.

**Adults: \$20**

### Troop Camping Skills—Tent


Completion of this overnight course enables participants to take troops camping in tents, cabins or lodges, on council-sponsored Brownie Camping and Junior Camping programs, or on town encampments. Explore ways to ensure a girl-led experience, safety and risk management, packing tips, fire-building, menu planning and outdoor cooking. Pre-course work required.

**Adults: \$25**

What training do I need?

Type of program	Volunteer Training Required
Travel program (not overnight)	One First Aid-certified volunteer
Overnight camping in tents*	One First Aid-certified volunteer AND One volunteer who has completed Troop Camping Skills—Tent
Overnight camping in lodges*	One First Aid-certified volunteer AND One volunteer who has completed Troop Camping Skills—Lodge or Troop Camping Skills—Tent
Other overnight programs	One First Aid-certified volunteer AND One volunteer who has completed one of the following: Online Overnight Orientation, Troop Camping Skills—Lodge, or Troop Camping Skills—Tent
Extended Trips: three nights or longer in the U.S. or any international trip	Prior council approval is required. Please contact CustomerCare@gsema.org.

*\*Exceptions: No additional training required for My Buddy and Me Campout or Gal's Night Out programs.*

Delegate

Represent Girl Scouts in your community and serve as the liaison between GSEMA's Board of Directors and staff, and the constituents you represent. New delegates are being sought for a three-year term beginning with the 2017-2018 membership year. Nominations are due by Nov. 3. Facilitator

Do you love Girl Scouting and want to share your leadership skills? New volunteers can greatly benefit from the knowledge of experienced volunteers. GSEMA facilitators strengthen troops and service units, and equip volunteers with the skills to deliver the Girl Scout Leadership Experience.

Gold Award Advisor

Help a Girl Scout let her inner leader shine! A Gold Award project advisor is chosen by a Senior or Ambassador to help plan and implement her project. Project advisors provide guidance, experience and expertise to the Gold Award candidate as she works to complete her Take Action project.

Service Unit Team Volunteer

Make a difference in your Girl Scouting community by joining a team of volunteers who provide local support to troop volunteers. The Service Unit Team promotes Girl Scouting locally by recruiting new members, organizing Girl Scout events, and guiding troops through the Fall Product and Cookie Programs.

These five recent graduates were recipients of the Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts Scholarship, in celebration of their extraordinary leadership, community engagement and personal commitment to the Girl Scout mission, as reflected in their Gold Award projects.

### Emma Arrighini, Sudbury

#### Project: *Reading Buddies*

To address reading fluency and comprehension deficits, Emma paired K-3 students with high schoolers as reading tutors, to read together in a safe space where the young students could challenge themselves. She also created a website with testimonials and other resources.

### Mira Blumen, Sharon

#### Project: *Getting Fit Together*

To address the needs of young women with Turner Syndrome, a chromosomal disorder preventing the body from maturing naturally, Mira created a nutrition and exercise workshop, a pamphlet, and an online community for girls to connect with and support one another.

### Mary Erickson, Norwood

#### Project: *Tikkun Olam (Repairing the World)*

Mary raised awareness about lesser known recyclable materials including foam, cork, crayons and tennis balls, by filming educational videos and coordinating a recycling event. As one of her project's successes, Norwood Public Schools has removed foam trays from its cafeterias.

### Meghan Mello, Raynham

#### Project: *25i Awareness*

To honor her best friend who passed away after taking the drug 25i, Meghan created a brochure and multi-media website to raise awareness of the dangers of recreational drugs. She presented her project at local schools, churches and other sites and plans to expand her presentations to other states.

### Samantha Newbury, Georgetown

#### Project: *Check Yes*

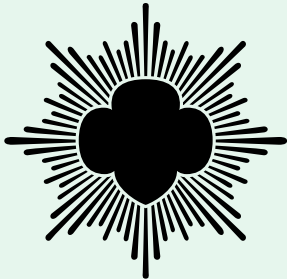
